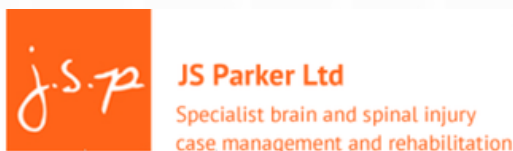

The Packages

My packages have been carefully put together from years of experience and understanding what support families need.

They include support for parents & carers, working with multi professionals, and regular time with the child.

I also provide support on the "admin" side to take away some of the burden and get things done.

This includes things like research, setting up meetings, keeping people in the loop, chasing things up and writing reports etc.

This time is recorded on my CRM system and charged in clear blocks.

Clinical Assessment & Report Package

What is included:

Pre Visit:

- Pre-assessment admin
- Detailed pre-assessment questionnaires for the parent/carer to complete
- 30 minute pre-assessment call
- A call or email liaison with the child's SENCO at school

The Assessment:

Comprehensive assessment of the child's presentation, strengths, challenges, with the home and school environment

The Report:

- Comprehensive and clear report
- Including child's strengths and challenges,
- an outline of the home and school environment and current equipment in use
- Provide recommendations of the child's therapy, equipment needs
- Detail any further assessments required
- I will include full clinical justification for any recommendations and costings

Follow up:

A follow up call to discuss my recommendations

Cost: £700 plus travel costs

Housing Assessment

What is included:

Pre Visit:

- Comprehensive assessment of the child's presentation, strengths, challenges, within the home environment
- Parent questionnaire
- Parent interview (30 minutes)

The Assessment:

2 hour assessment in the home

The Report:

- Detailed report will include child's strengths, challenges, of current housing
- Equipment and recommended housing needs
- Floor plans (current and proposed) and specifications for adaptations

Follow up:

A follow up call to discuss my recommendations

Additional Support:

If you require estimated costing for specialist equipment then there is an additional charge of £180
